



Mabel LY Moy died Thursday morning (August 27th) after a devastating stroke. She and her husband, James, have been members of KTAC for about 12 years. She began taking tennis lessons from Anthony, and became an avid tennis fan for years. She enjoyed taking Drills from Arnel and Eric, and looked forward to her USTA matches.

She loved being at the club. She cherished her 2.5 and 3.0 teammates and enjoyed visiting with members whom she had gotten to know. She enjoyed the Tennis Socials and, more recently, enjoyed participating in the Kitsap Tennis Summer League tournament. She cherished her friendships at the club, which had become a second home for her and James.

Mabel was born 1934 in Manhattan, New York. She was Valedictorian of her class at Washington Irving HS, received her Bachelor's degree in History at Brooklyn

College, Master's in Curriculum Development at Teachers College, Columbia University, and a PhD in Statistics & Educational Psychology at Ohio University, Athens, OH. She taught students in the 6th grade, taught part time at Wartburg College and the University of Northern Iowa, and eventually joined the Staff Team as an Evaluator on the WAMI project in the Office for Research for Medical Education (ORME) at the University of Washington.

Mabel was active with the Healing Tao Institute and traveled to China on a Study Tour on Meditation and Chinese Medical Practices with Michael Winn. She was certified as a Level One Instructor for the Institute. She was very active with the Mountaineers and had climbed to the Summit of Mt. Baker. She loved hiking with the Walkie Talkies hiking group in Mason and Kitsap County. She has been on study/vacation tours to Peru, Scotland, Spain, France, Italy, Egypt, Israel, Japan, Indonesia, and Thailand. She served on a World Mission Team for the Lutheran Church in America and was in India on a Study Tour when Indira Gandhi was assassinated. She attended St. Hugh of Lincoln Episcopal Church in Allyn.

Her favorite books were in history, theology, and philosophy; she enjoyed reading autobiographies. Before she died she enjoyed reading mystery novels. Of those her favorite authors were Lee Child, David Baldacci, Stuart Woods, and Jeffrey Archer.

Mabel is survived by her spouse James, sons Jim (Karen) and Tom (Yelena), and grandsons Michael and Alan who are attending the University of Colorado Boulder.
